Formerly Genesee Ecumenical Ministries, and also known as the Greater Rochester Community of Churches, the roots of ecumenical work in this agency date back to 1919 when early churches in the city began to work together to address the common good for all people.

The core of the Network's mission is to gather people from diverse communities to build relationships and support initiatives based on spiritual and community values that advocate, model, and celebrate basic human rights. Ecumenical worship services are held in the County Jails during the holiday season, various healing services throughout the year, and an annual creative worship workshop. The Faith In Action Celebration each June honors people of faith from all religious traditions and the Metropolitan Faith In Action Award is given to a community leader. The Faith in Action Network offers programs and gatherings around topics of religious and social justice issues.
