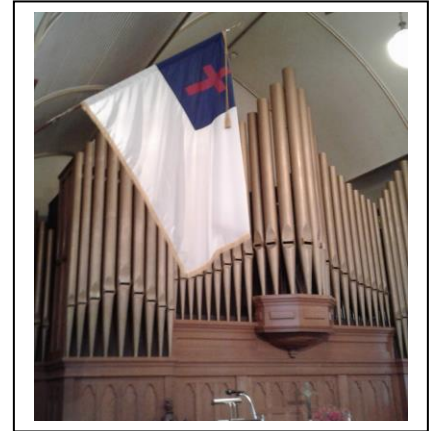

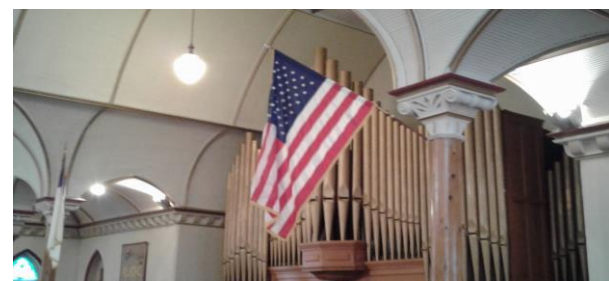


What to know: The Central Presbyterian Church of Avon was established in 1876 to proclaim and live the Faith of Christ in the then growing community of Avon in Livingston County, N.Y. The current Congregation is firmly engaged in the social and spiritual life of the community, as reflected by its multiple Ministries and Services, which include active involvement with the Avon Walk Against Hunger, the regional Food Pantry and the well-celebrated and joyful annual **Live Christmas out-door** festivities attracting large crowds to the streets of the village. The Church is very well-known for its Music Program, Bell Choir, Adult Choir, Youth Fellowship, and Adult Educational and Social Programs.
