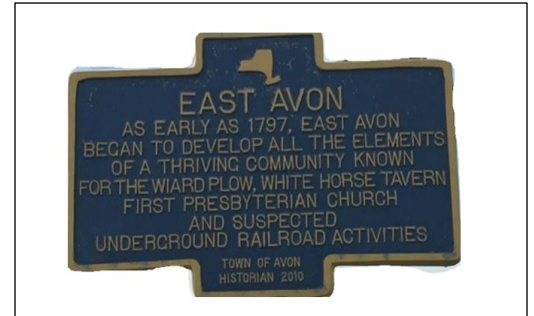

What to know: First Presbyterian Church of East Avon is a designated Historic Landmark in Livingston County, New York. The Congregation was established on November, 11th of 1810. Construction of the current Building was started in 1812 and dedicated as a Presbyterian House of Worship in 1827. The Historic marker placed in front of the Church facing current Routes 5 & 20 indicates that Avon and Livingston County were actively involved in civic issues including “suspected Underground Railroad Activities”. From its inception to the present, the East Avon Congregation has remained a vital component of the spiritual and social life of the surrounding Village and Countryside. Ongoing ministries include participation in the Interfaith Council of Livingston County, Annual Avon Walk Against Hunger and the dedicated work of the fellowship group Presbyterian Women Crafters. According to the Congregation’s Monthly Newsletter “The Windowpane”, active participation was registered for the 25th Annual Goulash Dinner in April, the Mother’s Day Cake and bake Sale in May and the upcoming Memorial Golf Tournament in July. For the 2019 Summer Reading Program, members of the Congregation are reading the Book FIVE PRACTICES OF FRUITFUL CONGREGATIONS written by Rev. Robert Schnaze, which is leading to animated and engaging monthly book-discussion sessions.
